

The Local 598 Executive Board and guest Genesee Prosecutor David Leyton were on hand as the Veterans Committee Chair and Local 598 Trustee David Garcia explains the meaning behind the 13 folds.

The American flag flying on the flagpole at the Union Hall had become worn and needed to be replaced. Fittingly, on Flag Day (June 14th), our Local 598 Veterans Committee performed the traditional formal ceremony used to honor a worn flag and replaced it with a new one.

Flag etiquette dictates that every time an American flag is

to be stored or presented during a ceremony, its handlers should fold it in half twice lengthwise; then starting with the end opposite the blue field, make a taut triangular fold. Handlers continue to fold the flag in triangles until the flag has formed a triangular "pillow" with the blue field showing on the outside. It's a dignified way to treat the flag, and gives a powerful touch to patriotic ceremonies.

This 13-fold procedure was common long before the more modern assigned meanings. The source and date of origin of the meanings is unknown, but for those who participate or witness a formal flag folding ceremony, whether it be on Flag Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Veterans Day, or at a military funeral, the 13 meanings can create an uplifting experience.

2. The second fold signifies our belief in eternal life.

13 FOLDS

- The third fold is made in honor and tribute of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace.
- The fourth fold exemplifies our weaker nature as citizens trusting in God; it
 is to Him we turn for His divine guidance.
- 5. The fifth fold is an acknowledgement to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."
- 6. The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.
- 7. The seventh fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies.
- 8. The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.
- 9. The ninth fold is an honor to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of men and women who have made this country great have been molded.
- **10.** The **10th fold** is a **tribute to father**, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first-born.
- **11.** The **11th fold**, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the **seal of King David and King Solomon** and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
- **12.** The **12th fold**, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, **represents an emblem of eternity** and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Ghost.
- 13. The last fold, when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

We thank the men and women of our veterans committee. Job well done.

I would like to thank and recognize Rosalyn Morse and the Diversity

Committee for their great work so far this year. They have produced education materials and great events.

June has become a month of recognition and embracing diversity. I hope everyone enjoyed their day off in honor of Juneteenth. This is a new holiday in the 2023 National Agreement.

Juneteenth commemorates the official end of slavery in the United States. On January 1, 1863, the **Emancipation Proclamation was** signed. This presidential decree was only enforced by the Army in areas of the country that the Union Army occupied. The southern states continued to come under the control of a growing Union Army, resulting in the liberation of the enslaved people.

Texas was the last holdout and continued to have slaves until Major General Gordon Granger issued General Order No. 3 freeing the 250,000 people still enslaved in Texas on June 19, 1865.

June is also Pride Month. Unions are based on equality and solidarity. During the month of June, we also take the opportunity to celebrate our brothers and sisters of the LGBTQ+ community. We continue to celebrate our differences and grow stronger through diversity.

The return of the Dependent Scholarship program in the 2023 National Agreement is finally being rolled out. One key point is that they gave us until July 15 to complete

the application for any money owed back to the effective date of the agreement. An additional key factor for future use of this benefit is that you have to be fully signed up prior to the next semester starting. They are not allowing you to sign up after the classes start.

Summer is here and once again the Chassis area is hot. Please protect your health and continue to stay hydrated throughout the day. It's hard to "catch up" on hydration, so drink continuously throughout your shift.

The committee has taken measures to support our members. We ensured the ice chest to supplement the ice machine is in the plant and full. We made sure there is Squencher (electrolyte drink) in the stores. We are also working through a list of fans that were not working and this work should be completed by the time you receive this paper.

When I took over as Chairperson, no areas of the plant were climate controlled, with the exception of some of the enclosed areas of the old Paint shop. Through multiple investments, we have been able to secure tempered air in Body shop, Paint shop, and Trim shop; leaving only Chassis Final (including the box line) to gain this improvement.

I am pursuing the \$30 million needed to complete my goal of the entire facility being cooled.

This year, we are taking a plant vacation shutdown, which we don't do very often anymore. I have memories as a child of GM's two-week shutdown, where every place we went was full of auto workers. It's a great

week to take a vacation with your family. The schedule is as follows:

- Friday, June 28last day of work
- Saturday, June 29.....off no pay
- Sunday, June 30.....off no pay
- Monday, July 1 .. mandatory vacation
- Tuesday, July 2 .. mandatory vacation
- Wednesday, July 3mandatory
- Thursday, July 4 holiday pay, Independence Day
- Friday, July 5holiday pay 2023 Agreement bridge day
- Saturday, July 6off no pay
- Sunday, July 7.....off no pay
- Monday, July 8return to work

We have been dealing with a lot of movement in the plant. This movement is the result of 111 people retiring, new apprentice offers, and transfers to FMC. The resulting special applications to transfer, shift bumping, and job postings have allowed many members to improve their work life with better job assignments.

The plant will be down the first week of July, which is our Special Application to Transfer window.

With more potential movement, we made a one-time modification of the process. During the week of July 1-7, the online Special Application process will be available. We have also added July 8-12. Both the online and the inperson applications will be accepted.

We have a fun event planned for the summer. The Local 598 Golf Outing will be held August 25th at Lapeer


