



This can be a joyous time of the year for many of us. There are multiple UAW-negotiated paid holidays and plenty of celebrations to attend. Unfortunately, this is coupled with many people negatively impacted by tragedy. In a large part due to the dietary and exercise practices, this time of the year we inevitably lose members, or they lose family members, to heart attacks. In addition, for people already struggling emotionally, the stress of the holidays magnifies their negative thoughts, which results in an increase in suicides.

Please look after each other and your family members. Don't be afraid to talk to them about their physical and mental health. Sometimes, a simple "I care" can change things for them.

The \$50k Special Attrition Package (SAP) opens for application on November 22 and will close January 5, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. The sign-up process is different than any other packages we have had. To be eligible for the SAP, employees must have been hired on or before October 15, 2007 and be eligible for a normal retirement by March 31, 2025.

Normal retirement includes 30 years, 85 points (combination of age and service time), 65 years old, or 60 years old with 10 years of service. Interested employees can sign the SAP application online through *Workday* during the application window. Employees can apply or cancel as many times as they want to during the 45-day window.

Any application on file at the end of the period will be honored and the employees will be required to retire. There is *no* 7 days revoke period after January 5th for the application. Retirements will occur starting March 1st through September 1st. The company will determine retirement dates and provide those to employees by January 17th. Thirty days prior to your retirement date, the company will provide a waiver to sign that is required to receive the \$50k. Once signed, you do have 7 days to revoke the waiver only. Employees who fail to sign the liability waiver or revoke it will still be required to retire based on the application, not the waiver.

The company has unilaterally made a change in the Family and Medical Leave of Absence (FMLA) process. All employees with FMLA will be required to recertify that claim in January, regardless of when original application was made.

The Retirees \$500 bonus will be paid the first week of December. This will go to all retirees who retired prior to or under the 2023 agreement and surviving spouses. In addition, the "Delphi check the box" retirees will receive the \$500 plus the \$500 from last year that the company disputed owing them.

There is an obscure bit of language in the benefits agreements that the company did not catch. Employees who are 73 years old can draw their pension and keep working. If you are eligible and

interested, please see one of our Union Benefits Reps.

As a reminder, the \$1,500 new car purchase voucher has to be used in the 2024 calendar year. To use the voucher, you have to take delivery of the vehicle in 2024. If ordering in 2024 and not receiving until calendar year 2025, the voucher will have expired and you won't get that discount off. You can acquire the authorization code for your GM discount and the voucher separately on *GM Family First*.

Our FTT employees have 16 hours paid and 24 hours unpaid vacation time. Please work with your group leader to find the opportunity to use the 16 hours of paid time. It is lost if unused at the end of the year. I understand it's so late in the year you won't be able to get premium days like Monday, Fridays or black out days, but take whatever you can get. The hours will replenish on January 5, 2025.

The national agreement contract books are expected to arrive at the Local Union Hall by the end of the year. We will distribute them as soon as possible.

OWEN BIEBER SCHOLARSHIP

During the time Owen Bieber served on the Chrysler Board of Directors, he donated the money he was afforded to fund these academic scholarships at GVSU, to be used by our qualified members and their families.

The application for the Owen Bieber Scholarship is to be completed online. Students must follow the instructions carefully. The rules and qualifications are spelled out on the online form.

In order to apply for the Owen Bieber Scholarship, students must already be admitted into GVSU. Once they are admitted, students use their GVSU credentials (which they received when accepted) to log into the *myScholarships* system. After signing in, the student will be asked a list of questions. Qualifications and instructions will be found online.


ALL HEROES Don't Wear CAPES

In honor of Veteran's Day, our Local 598 Veteran's Committee held a short program in the plant to honor our 2024 Veteran of the Quarter recipients of the Domingo Berlanga, Sr. Memorial Service Award (DBMSA). The theme this year was "All heroes don't wear capes. They wear dog tags and combat boots."

Brother Berlanga, a Korean War Veteran, was a member of our Veteran's Committee and was a perfect example of that idea. 

Flint Labor Leader Passes...

Stan Marshall



Stanley Orville Marshall, age 96, of Lakeview, formerly of Otisville, passed away surrounded by his family on Tuesday, October 29, 2024, at Corewell Health Hospital in Greenville. Stan was the patriarch of a large Marshall family and a leader and respected member of a much larger UAW family. From the final assembly line at the Buick plant in Flint to a Vice President post in Solidarity House in Detroit, Stan was ever loyal to his union family and worked tirelessly to advance their interests.

Stan was employed by General Motors in 1950 and worked at Buick in Flint until becoming part of the International staff in 1977. While at Buick, he worked in the final assembly plant, was a committee man, Shop

Committee, and Chairperson of the bargaining unit. In 1977 Stan joined the International staff in Region 1C and was elected as Regional Director in 1983. In 1989, he was elected to the International UAW board as a Vice President and served in that position until his retirement in June of 1995.

In retirement, he continued to serve his union family by representing retirees and organizing services and programs for those retirees.

Local 598 sends their condolences to the Marshall family and a deep appreciation for sharing Brother Stan with all of us during his decades of service to the UAW, his community and our country.
